DR MATHEW CHERIAN, chief of Radiology services, Kovai Medical Centre and Hospital (KMCH) has been elected president of the Indian Society of Vascular and Interventional Radiology (ISVIR).

Dr Cherian, as founder member of the 12-year-old Indian Society of Vascular and Interventional Radiology, has played a proactive

role in popularising the minimally invasive surgical techniques among the surgeons.

Interventional radiology has been practiced in the country for more than two decades. However, only a meagre fifty hospitals were actively practising the vital speciality.

Dr Cherian said that several procedures under this speciality could be used to save the lives of patients, especially in treating active bleeding when no other option is available.
